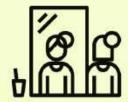

OVERARCHING PRINCIPLES - WHAKAMĀUI | RECOVERY (TE PAPA)

THE BICULTURAL FOUNDATION OF TE PAPA ALONGSIDE THE PRINCIPLE OF MANA TAONGA AND OUR RESPONSIBILITIES OUTLINED IN TE TIRITI O WAITANGI GUIDE HOW THE MUSEUM OPERATES. THE FOLLOWING OVERARCHING PRINCIPLES OUTLINE SOME PRACTICAL WAYS THAT THESE FOUNDATIONS WILL BE APPLIED TO THE WHAKAMĀUI | RECOVERY PHASE.

MANAAKITANGA

The decisions made around moving between alert levels follows a process of showing respect, generosity, care and support for others by extending aroha to them and their circumstances. By operating under a process of manaakitanga we secure the strength of our own whānau and our manuhiri (visitors).

HAUORA

THE PRIORITY IS THE WELLNESS IN BODY, MIND AND SPIRIT OF OUR OURSELVES, OUR WHĀNAU AND OUR MANUHIRI (VISITORS).

KAITIAKITANGA - PUPURITANGA

TE PAPA HAS A RESPONSIBILITY TO CARE FOR ALL OF THE TAONGA THAT WE CURRENTLY CARE FOR, OUR BUILDING AND THE ENVIRONMENT AROUND US. THIS INCLUDES A RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN IMPORTANT RELATIONSHIPS WITH IWI MĀORI, AND REGIONAL MUSEUMS WHO HOLD TAONGA Ā-IWI IN THEIR CARE. A PRIORITY IS THE HAUORA OF THESE AND THE MANAAKITANGA EXTENDED TO THEM.

KOTAHITANGA ME TE MAHITAHI

In order to move forward we must operate with unity, togetherness, solidarity and with collective action to identify as one whānau. A series of wānanga will be held to bring our people together to wānanga together in an open forum what is before us. Wānanga will also be held with various iwi partners with regard to tikanga, care and management of taonga and other matters. These wānanga would also provide an opportunity for whakawhanaungatanga.

KARAKIA

KARAKIA AND APPROPRIATE KAWA WILL BE UNDERTAKEN TO OPEN AREAS OF TE PAPA IN A WAY THAT UPHOLDS OUR TIKANGA. THIS PROCESS IS UNDERTAKEN TO CONSIDER THE CULTURAL SAFETY OF OUR PEOPLE, TAONGA AND OUR MANUHIRI.

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
